

## DO WE NEED WOMEN'S MINISTRIES?

### Some things to consider:

Generally women are more likely to be evangelized by other women. Because of the natural likeliness of coming together with other women in the work place, with their children, etc. women have greater contact with each other. Friendships begin and that can lead to evangelism.

As women, we need to take seriously the responsibility to disciple other women. Titus 2:3-5 clearly directs women to minister to other women.

Women's Ministries can meet the unique needs of women that can be overlooked by regular church activities. Women of today are often overworked, exhausted, hurting, and lonely.

Women's Ministries provide women with an opportunity and place to use their spiritual gifts and their God-given talents.

Women's Ministry can help churches grow by providing an entry point.

The Evangelical Fellowship of Canada recently did a survey and found that children generally follow the beliefs of their mother – all the more reason to win women to the Lord and to disciple them.

### Examples of Women's Ministries:

- a group of women meeting regularly for Bible Study
- one woman organizing a group of women to meet needs of a family in crisis
- an organized committee planning a large event for church and/or unchurched women
- one woman praying over the phone with another woman
- a woman writing notes of encouragement to new moms
- a group of women praying together for public schools
- a craft group meeting at church
- an organized leadership team planning regular meetings
- a group of women planning a women's retreat
- two women visiting the sick, elderly, newcomers, etc.
